Meeting opened 6:31

1. Minutes approved for July 2023 approved and signed
2. Treasurer's Reports for July & August 2023 reports reviewed and accepted. Kim noted the differences between July & August reports as a CDARS had been added as well as a 4,000.00 Building CD. A lot of the other CD had been matured and updated to the higher interest rates as well.
3. Tax Collector and IFW July & August 2023 reports reviewed and accepted.
4. Safety / Roads & Emergency Management update: Bill informed us Mike will be doing the ditching and pot holes along with grading where needed. Roads holding up well but will be touching up where needed. He had bought 10 bags of cold patch and has filled the holes at the entrance of Black Point. He felt it was better for the Town to bite the bullet and do it as State will never get to it. He also stated he went down and worked on Prong Pond boat Landing road himself and that is now is much better.
5. LUPC: 2 applications. George Cummins (9/21) commercial Sporting Camp into a potential Residential Subdivision and Ellenwoods (9/20) for a new dwelling. A permit for Gruenburg was issued for rock relocation.
6. School Update: Sally said Meeting was cancelled for a family emergency till October 3. A 90 page report was issued from the Superintendent for all as she is up for review. Beaver Cove has 4 students 2 elementary and 2 high school.
7. Emergency Management / Community Resilience: Sally had written a informational letter for the Board to review and approve to be put in with

the tax bills with Beaver Cove Logo. She also informed us that do to a technical error Greenville's application did not get reviewed and they will have to apply for a new grant. She is also looking the dry hydrant issue again. She had reviewed it last year with Sawyer and LaConte and got numbers which she is sure have increased possibly up to 50,000. – 100,000. Sawyer said to keep in touch maybe he can find some help as well. Alison thanked Sally for her work She contacted the Augusta Compliance office. She also said she had stopped in and picked up the push talk phones from Jaime at Piscataquis. Still no Emergency Management Director but have reached out to an individual in hopes she can help in some sort of way.

8. Budget Committee will be meeting October 5 at 12 noon in the community room. All are welcome Donna Keltz agreed to be the head of the Budget Committee.
